

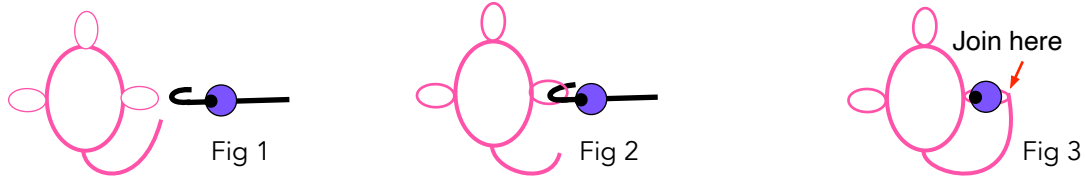
Adding Beads to Picots Jane Eborall © 2015

Adding a bead to a picot before joining another part of the pattern can be done two ways whether the picot is on a ring or a chain.

Method 1

Take a very fine crochet hook (a 0.4mm will fit through size 11 seed beads) and place the bead onto the hook. Several can be put on depending on the length of the shaft and if required.

Catch the hook through the picot you're joining to.



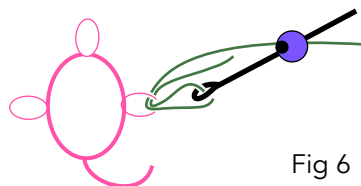
Move the bead onto the picot and, keeping the hook in place use it to make your new join to the space at the end of the picot.

Method 2

Sometimes beads are too small for the smallest hook so in this case take a fine sewing/ beading needle and add sewing thread. Place the bead onto the needle and move down the thread so that it's on the single threaded part. Take the needle through the picot.



Now take the needle back through the bead and slide the bead onto the picot. Remove the needle and thread.



Once more join to the space at the end of the picot.
