## Abbreviations

Materials required: 2 shuttles, thread (number 20 gives a cat measuring roughly $2^{\prime \prime}$ in length), 2 size 11 seed beads. Add one bead to each shuttle thread.
Knowledge of split rings required.
Note - for those who prefer front side/back side tatting the text in italics and red indicates where the worker needs to use the second half of the ds first.
Add a bead to each thread before starting.
Starting at the end of the tail tie ends with an overhand knot.

## Tail \& rear

Ch: 15 SS - do not pull too tight
SR1: 4 vsp $4 / 8 \mathrm{Cl}$
SR2: 6 vsp $2 / 8 \mathrm{Cl}$ SS

## Back legs - first

Ch: 5 vsp 1 SLT RW
Ch: 5 DNRW SS
R3: 6 Cl RW
Ch: $6+(v s p$ last but one Ch) SLT RW


Ch: 5 Lj (vsp base SR2) SLT RW

## Second back leg

Ch: 1 vsp 5 vsp 1 SLT RW
Ch: 5 DNRW SS
R4: 6 Cl RW
Ch: $5+(v s p$ last but one Ch) SLT RW
Ch: 6 Lj (vsp Ch) 6 RW

## Middle body

SR5: 4 + (vsp SR1) 4 / 4 vsp 4 Cl


Ch: 3 Lj (vsp SR7) 7 RW
SR9: 4 vsp 2 vsp 2 vsp $1 / 4$ CI SS

## Bottom Front Leg

Ch: 1 vsp 6 vsp 4 RW
R10: 6 CI DNRW SS


## Face

Note - when you have moved the eye bead into place make sure that the top of the following double stitch lies as close as possible to the previous one - see fig. 5
Ch: 6 B (nose - B on Ch) 4 MB (eye - on core thread) 3 (ear) 2 - (ear) 6 RW
R12: 2 + (vsp SR9) 3 + (vsp SR7) 2 / 4 Cl RW
Ch: $4 L j(v s p$ SR6) $4 L j$ (vsp SR6) $4 T$ \& $C$ to base of tail.
