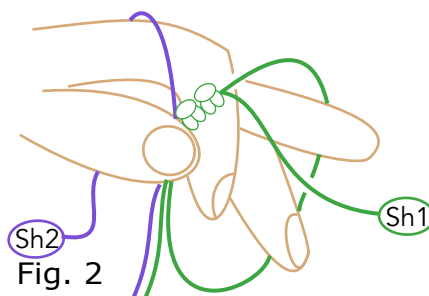
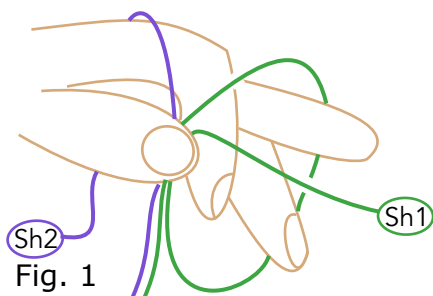


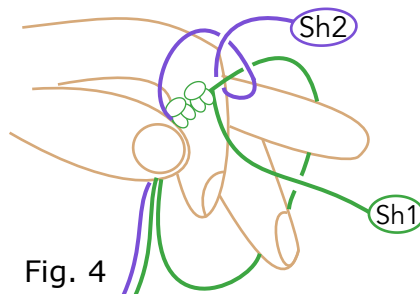
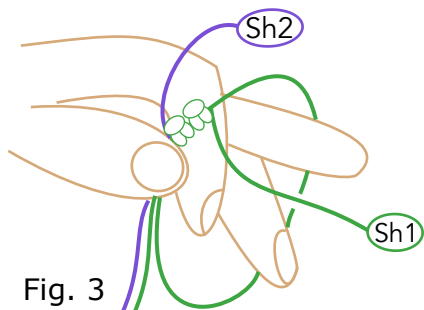


The daisy picot technique follows a regular ring, split ring or chain and requires two shuttles using two colours.

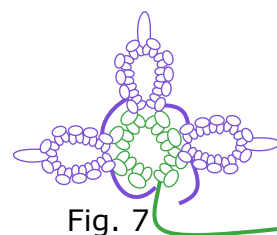
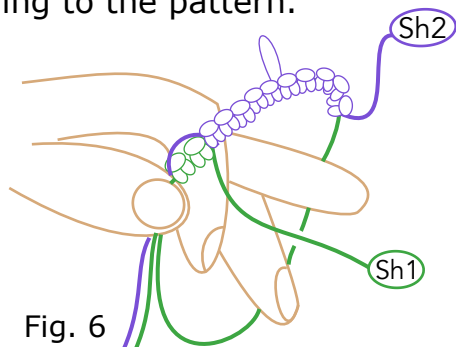
Place shuttle 2 over the left hand out of the way and using Sh1 make a ring of 2 doubles (Fig. 1 & Fig. 2). Drop Sh1 down in front of the work and pick up Sh2.



Leave a small amount of thread showing over the top of the 2 previous doubles and make 5 doubles over the thread round the hand - the core thread. When making this part of the daisy **DO NOT FLIP THE THREAD**. See Fig. 3, Fig.4 & Fig. 5. This will form the petal of the flower and will appear to turn inwards until you have finished this part of the technique.



Now place Sh2 over the back of your left hand and return to Sh1. Snug stitches up to each other and make 2 more ring stitches as usual. **REMEMBER TO FLIP THESE TWO KNOTS!** Repeat according to the pattern.



By alternating the two shuttles you will form a daisy picot ring (DPR). See Figs. 6 and 7.
