SR2: 4 VLp (2" leg) 1 + (VLp after twisting 15 times) 2 VLp (2"

leg) 1 + (VLp after twisting 15 times) 4 / 8 Cl RW

Lch: 3 Tie overhand knot & cut.

Tree - 2 shuttles.

1¼ yards green thread on shuttle 1 and 1 yard brown on shuttle 2.

Tie threads together with a weaver's knot and hide ends in chain.
