


## **Introduction to Juliana**

I found beautiful doily in Book 3 of the Frivolite series (3 booklets) which were published in 1952 by Eska (a publisher) in Utrecht. A few alterations have been made (particularly to round 9) to make the doily easier to work. Throughout I have used 2 shuttles and have worked with size 20 thread. The finished piece measures 26" by 16" when worked in this size thread.

You will note that I have not put a copyright notice on this as I would rather have referred to the original designer although the translation, text and drawings are mine. I believe in copyright being assigned to the designer but in this case, even through extensive research, all I've gleaned is that the designs in the book series were done by nuns living in a monastery in Amsterdam. As this was such a pretty doily I did not want to let it become lost forever. The text and photograph which were all I had to work from. Many thanks must go to Riet Surtel-Smeulders who gave me the original two books and to Google translate for his help too!!

Nieuwe bloem, boog  $1 \times 12$  d.kn. verbinden aan kl. ring, ring  $2 \times 3$  d.kn., boog  $1 \times 10$  en  $1 \times 5$  d.kn. verbinden met vorige toer, boog  $1 \times 12$  d.kn. verbinden aan kleine ring, boog  $1 \times 12$  d.kn. verbinden aan nieuwe bloem, deze bloem verbinden aan de vorige toer. Afhechten.
