

## **Repairing after cutting a picot**

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This page is a suggested way of repairing a piece of work if a picot has been cut on the previous row. Although this shows a chain picot that has been cut accidentally it will also work for a ring picot as long as there are sufficient doubles to unpick and re-sew.

This image shows where the picot has been accidentally cut.



Unpick the doubles each side of the broken picot back to the end of the chain OR if it's a ring – to the next joining double but leaving a half stitch in place.



Sew those two ends into the previous chains OR (if the same colour) the rings.



Take a shuttle with the same colour as the previous chains and work a split chain over the exposed core thread. You can hide the end in the first few double stitches.



Continue to the end of the chain and then hide the end in a previous element as before.
