# **HOME** Sally's Bugle Snowflake © Jane Eborall - 2017







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## Materials required

2 colours No. 20 Crochet cotton, 2 shuttles, bugle beads and size 11 seed beads.

**NOTE.** The pattern is written for ¼" bugle beads but other sizes can be used with a little adjustment.

#### **Abbreviations**

B Bead shuttle thread (replaces picot) LBPbug Add seed beads and bugle beads, seed bead as

shown

Btwn between MB Move bead into place on core thread

Cl close DNRW Do not reverse work

LCh Lock chain (1<sup>st</sup> half normal, 2<sup>nd</sup> halfLj Lock join

wrapped)

RW Reverse work T & C Tie and cut

DNRW Do not reverse work

2½ yards on shuttle 1 (this is the colour on the inside rings) and 4½ yards on shuttle 2. Add 36 seed beads to shuttle 2 thread.

#### Round 1


Using shuttle 1 one make

R1: 6 doubles then add central beads as follows

Make a loop next to the last double worked and place first beads on the loop (bead, bugle, bead = LBPbug).

There is no need to add a pin to hold them in place. Fig. 1

Snug beads up to the work.



Pull another loop from the **top of the set of beads already added to the thread** and add the second set of beads – see arrow on Fig. 1.

You will need to pull thread out from the shuttle and the thread round the hand. This will constantly need adjusting when adding further beads.


Hold the second LBPbug in place with a safety pin or paperclip.


Snug LBPbug up to the previous one. Fig. 2


Pull another loop on the thread emerging from the bottom of the second set of beads and add beads as before.


Again a safety pin is required to hold it in place. Don't forget to snug these beads up too. Fig. 3


Repeat for the fourth, fifth and sixth LBP sets of beads. See below (fig. 4, 5 and 6)












When the  $6^{th}$  set of beads has been added pull the thread back into the ring. Make sure all threads are snugged up.

Work 6 doubles and close the ring. RW. See fig. 6.

\* Ch: 8 LBP (1 bugle, 1 seed) 2 LBP (2 bugles, 1 seed) 2 LBP (1 bugle, 1 seed) 8 RW

R2: 6 + (next LBPbug removing holding pin) 6 Cl RW Repeat from \* 4 times followed by a final chain which is joined to the base of R1. Continue with round 2.



### Round 2

LCh: 8 Lj (1st LBPbug) 5 SS DNRW

5 beads at back of hand

SR1: 4 B 4 BBB MB 4 B 4 / 1 Lj (2<sup>nd</sup> LBPbug) 1 Cl SS DNRW

LCh: 5 Lj (3<sup>rd</sup> LBPbug) 8 Lj to base R2

Repeat from \* all round. T & C
