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This pattern is best worked with the same colour on each shuttle - variegated works well.

This flying bug has a sting in it's tail. BEWARE - once stung you will become a tating addict for the rest of your life!! No ends to sew in either!!!

**Materials required**

Small amounts of size 20 thread and size 11 seed beads.

**Note** – for those who prefer front side/back side tating the text in *italics and red* indicates where the worker needs to use the second half of the ds first.

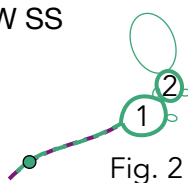
Add two size 11 beads to shuttle 1.

Tie shuttle ends together with an overhand knot and then, using shuttle 1.

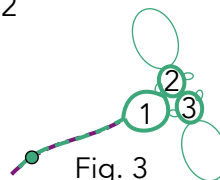
